INTRODUCTION

Prior to Jesus, no one called the Almighty, most holy God, "Father". It would have been not just unthinkable, but blasphemous. In fact, from the perspective of the law, Jesus was crucified not because of what he had done, but because of who he said he was...The Son of God. Yet, this is exactly what Jesus did for us. Through faith in him we become children of God. Jesus paved the way for us to be adopted into the family of God. This changes everything. It is an identity shift. It is a forever inheritance. It is an adoption into the royal family.

- 5. Think of someone whose relationship with God you admire. What about their relationship with Him is so appealing?
- 6. How is your relationship with God?
 - What are some things you do (or could do) to invest in your relationship with Him?

Go around your group and ask for prayer requests. Pray we would recognize that we are children of God and that he desires a relationship with us. Pray for God to show us opportunities to grow in our relationship with Him.
